How to Resize & Rename a JPG File in Windows 10

Right click the jpg you wish to resize and select Copy.




Then in a blank area near but not on your jpg, <u>right</u> click again and select <u>Paste</u>. You now have a copy of your jpg.



This is the result.




Right click the COPY of your jpg and select <u>Edit</u>. (By resizing the Copy you leave your original jpg untouched.)




How to Resize & Rename a JPG File in Windows 10

This opens an editing window that allows you to resize your image. The <u>Resize</u> command is in the upper left of the window.




When you click <u>Resize</u>, a small window opens. <u>Important: If in that window Resize by Percentage is selected, click Pixels instead (see below)</u>. Then change the <u>longest</u> dimension to the required size for your purpose. In this example, changing 1600 to 2000 <u>automatically</u> changes the other dimension proportionately.



Click OK to finalize the resizing. See next page.


Then close the Resizing window (click X in the upper right of the window). A small window will open asking if you want to save the jpg you just resized. Click <u>Save</u> and the window will close.



This brings you back to your copy jpg, which you may rename accordingly.

How to **Rename** a JPG in Windows 10

Right click the jpg file and click Rename.



This highlights the existing file name.



Simply type the new file name and hit Enter. If you make a mistake, just repeat the above steps.
